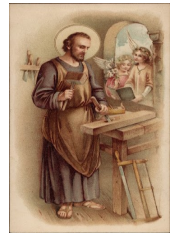

From the Pastor's Desk:

This is the second in a series of articles about the Corporal Works of Mercy. As a reminder, "corporal" comes from the Latin word for "body", so these are ways to show God's love and mercy to people for their physical well-being. The Corporal Works of Mercy are to feed the hungry, to give water to the thirsty, to clothe the naked, to shelter the homeless, to visit the sick, to visit the imprisoned/ransom the captive, and to bury the dead.

Last week, my article was about visiting the sick. This week I want to discuss feeding the hungry and giving water to the thirsty.

Feeding and giving drink to people seems like something that is not an issue in our country, but it is. According to the USDA, over 40 million people in our country struggle with having enough food on a regular basis. Families with children are part of that group. 1 in 6 children don't always know where their next meal is coming from. I think of these kids during the summer and school breaks as they rely on their school for breakfast and lunch.

In our local communities, there are efforts to help. I know there is Kid's Cafe in the summer in Winnebago. Our parishes also do a lot to help with the ETCMA food pantry in Walthill, located in the basement of the St. Joseph's rectory. We are always looking for volunteers, so if you feel drawn to help the hungry in our area, let me or one of the Sisters know.

It is so easy to turn a blind eye to those who are hurting. It is also easy to assume the poor are all struggling because they are lazy or addicts. Do you know that the biggest segment of people struggling with poverty are the working poor? These people have low paying jobs, but still struggle to make ends meet.

Efforts to alleviate poverty have to include helping people get jobs and provide for themselves. At the same time, we are called to help people who are hurting right here and right now. As Christians, we do not have the option of ignoring people. Jesus said, "whatever you do for the least of my people, you do for me." When we help feed the hungry and give drink to the thirsty, we are feeding and giving drink to Jesus.

Saints Joseph, Augustine, Our Lady of Fatima, and Cornelius, pray for us.

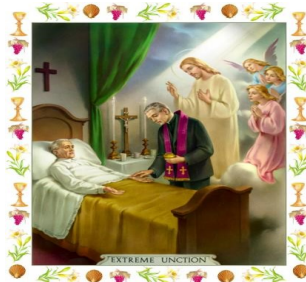
